

Describe due diligence practices and procedures with respect to indigenous rights of communities in which it operates or intends to operate (SASB EM-MM-210a.3)

Rio2 Limited is committed to respecting the rights of Indigenous Peoples in accordance with applicable Chilean legislation, and ILO Convention 169. The Company recognizes the rights of Indigenous Communities to participate in decisions that may affect them, to preserve their cultural heritage and traditional practices, and to engage in meaningful dialogue throughout the project lifecycle.

As part of its human rights due diligence process, Rio2 Limited identifies Indigenous Communities within the project's area of influence through baseline social studies, stakeholder mapping, and ongoing engagement activities. Potential impacts are assessed through the Environmental Impact Assessment process, while mitigation and management measures are incorporated into project planning. The Company maintains continuous dialogue with Indigenous Communities through structured engagement processes, grievance mechanisms, and periodic monitoring of commitments.

Rio2 Limited does not operate in conflict-affected areas.

Our Fenix Gold Project is located in Chile, a country that is not considered an active conflict zone. Nevertheless, as part of its Environmental Assessment process and in alignment with the standards established within the organization, Rio2 Limited has undertaken a range of activities involving the participation of the Colla Indigenous Communities and members of Civil Society, including:
